Authors whose papers will be considered as suitable for the special issue will be notified by **31 May 2025**. The full text is due on **31 December 2025**. The papers will be reviewed by at least two anonymous reviewers during January-March 2026. Revised papers are to be sent to the editors by **30 June 2026**. The special issue will be published in the second half of 2026.
