The Prague Series

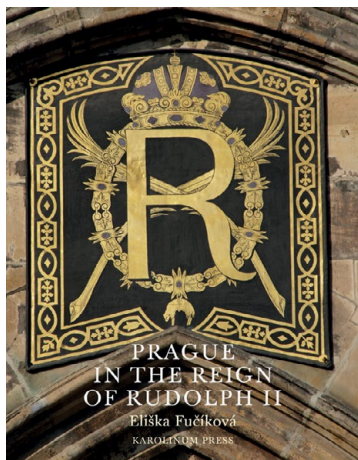

The series designates Prague as a historical and cultural phenomenon, concisely showing the thousand-year development of the city through its material and spiritual transformations, as well as its legendary genius loci, thus spreading awareness of Czech culture and its educational achievements. The standard volume of the series consists of a general interpretation of a certain theme accompanied by illustrations and “a walk through Prague,” which contains a captioned collection of photographs of historical sites still in existence today. The publication is complemented by a list of prominent personalities, an index and map of important places, and the author’s bibliography.
